Then, touch the number 1.

Then, touch the number 1 again.

The Dispatcher will answer.

Give the Dispatcher the information that they need to send help to you.

HOW TO DIAL 911

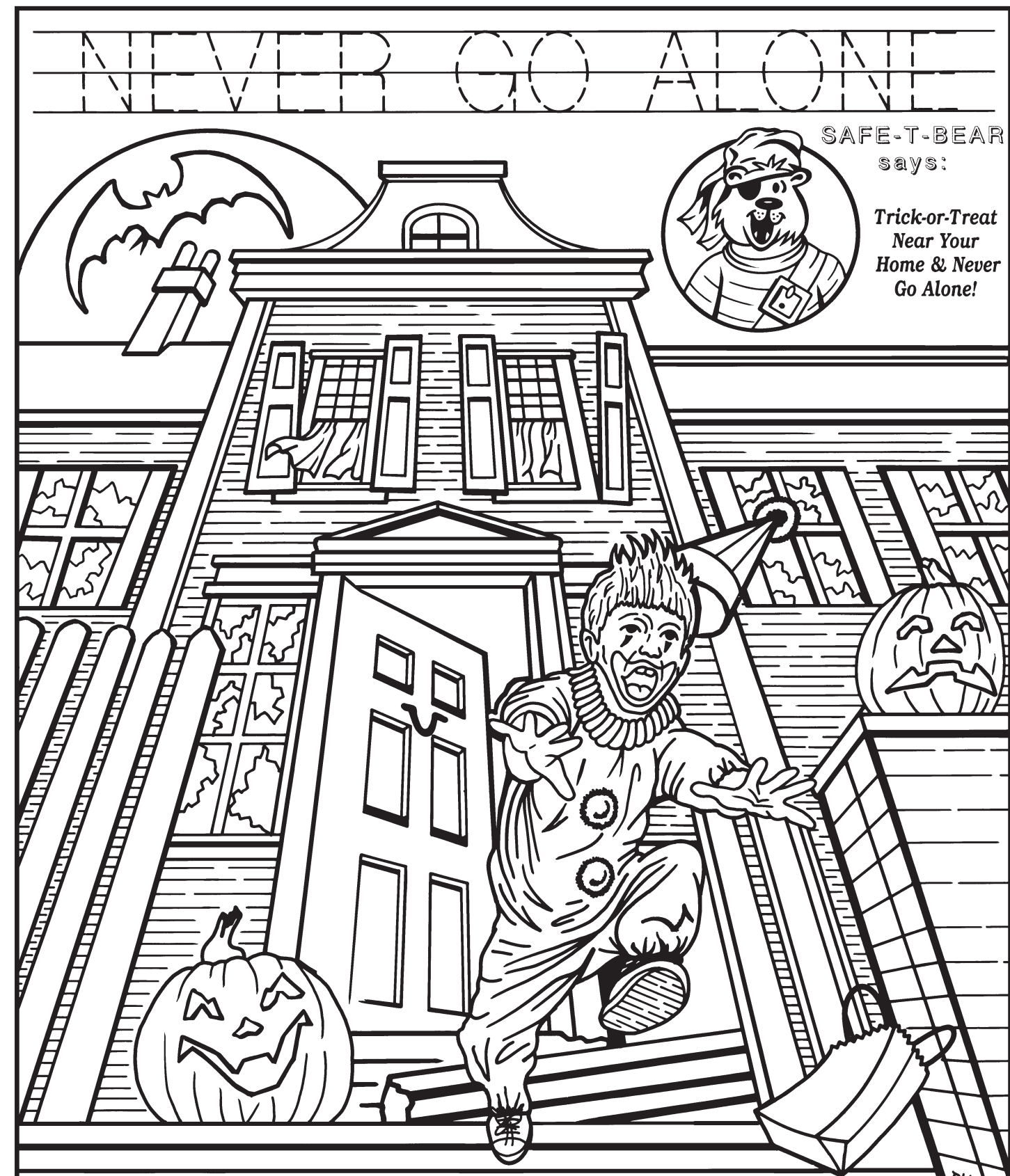
For FIRE, RESCUE, MEDICAL or POLICE EMERGENCY just pick up the phone and DIAL: 911. Speak slowly and clearly to the dispatcher. Give them your name, address and phone number. If you are not at home, tell them where you are. **Do not panic!** Help will be on the way very soon!

Do Not Hang Up The Phone Until The Dispatcher Tells You To!



NEVER TRICK-OR-TREAT ALONE!

It's much more fun to get together and go trick-or-treating with a group of friends! Ask the adults that are going with you to walk a short distance behind, that way it will look as if your parents are not with you! Never cross any streets unless an adult is right there with you. *Remember: your safety is number one!*

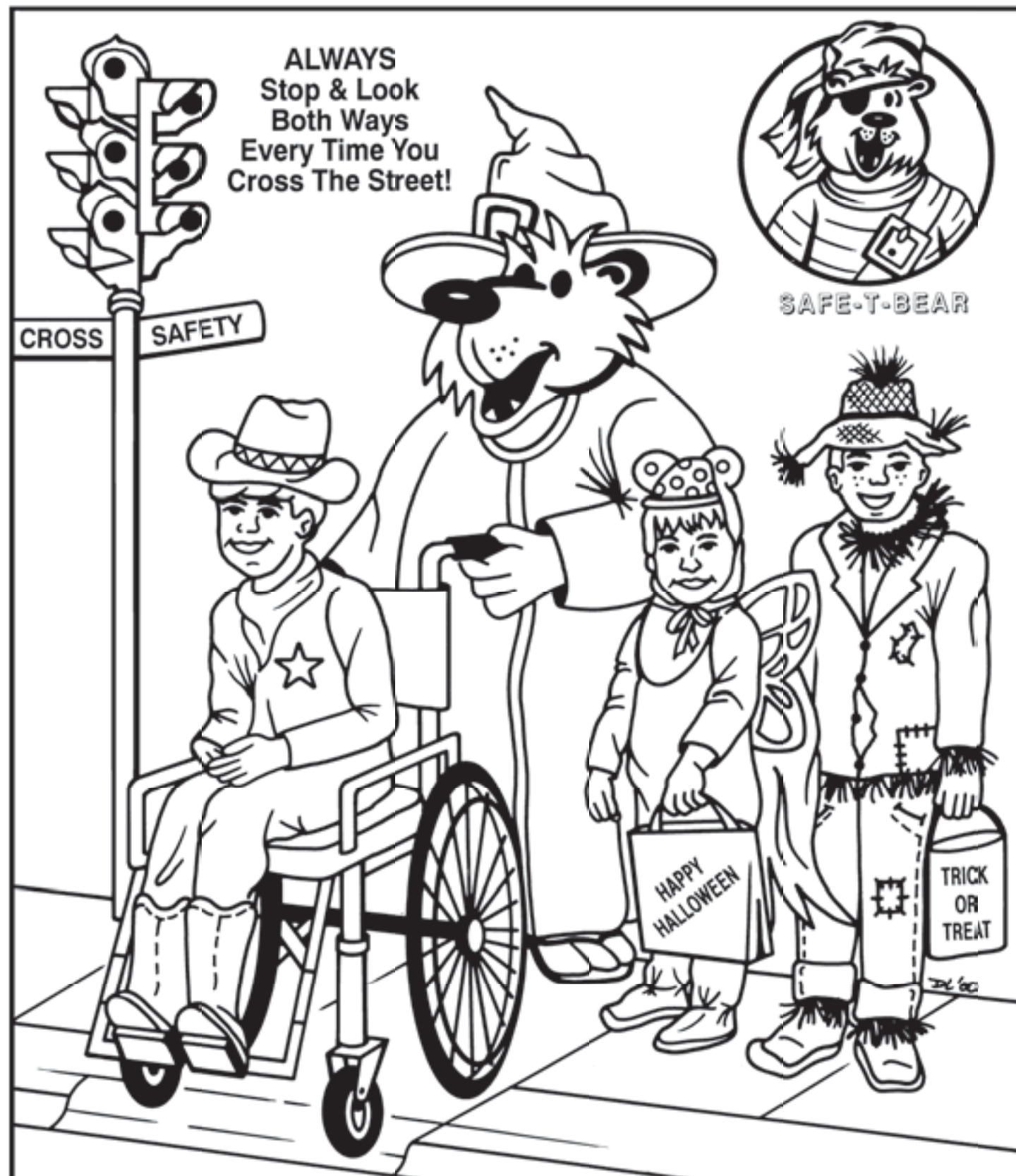

DON'T GET SPOOKED... GO WHERE YOU KNOW IT'S SAFE

It is best to only Trick-or-Treat at homes in your neighborhood that you know are safe. Be careful of strangers, and never go inside someone's house or get into a car unless you and your parents know that person very well. *Don't do a real disappearing act!*

FOLLOW ALL TRAFFIC SAFETY RULES

Have a lot of fun on Halloween by following all traffic safety rules. Always remember to look both ways before you cross any street. Be sure to cross only at corners and crosswalks. If you are wearing a mask, take it off whenever you cross the street. Younger children should hold their parents hands.



IF YOU GO IN THE DARK, "GLOW-IN-THE-DARK"

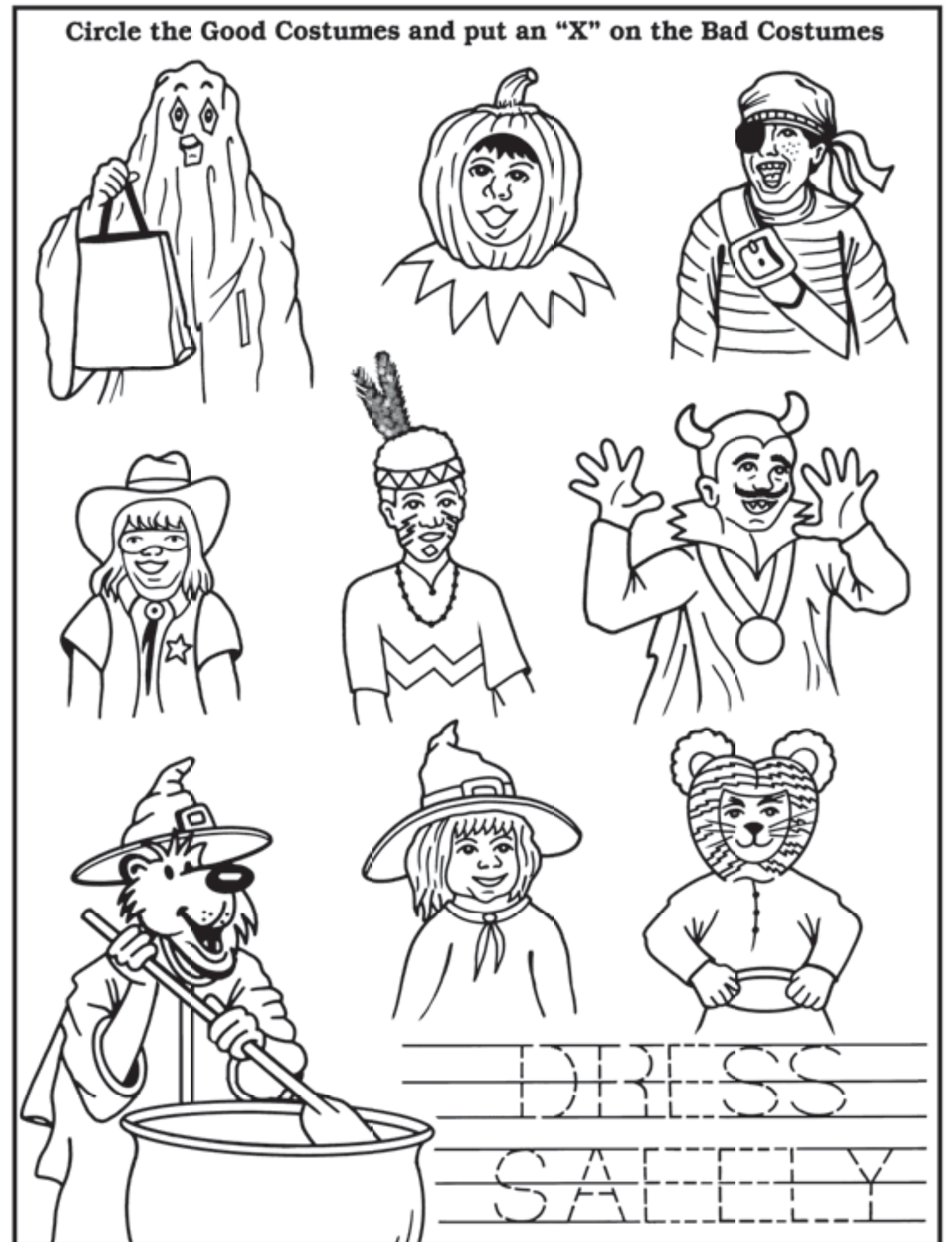
It gets dark early in October, so be sure to bring a flashlight with you. Also place reflective stripes and glow-in-the-dark stickers on your costume. Tell your parents to dress safely too! Carry a flashlight to help you see better in darker areas. You can also have fun by using the flashlight to make spooky faces with your friends!

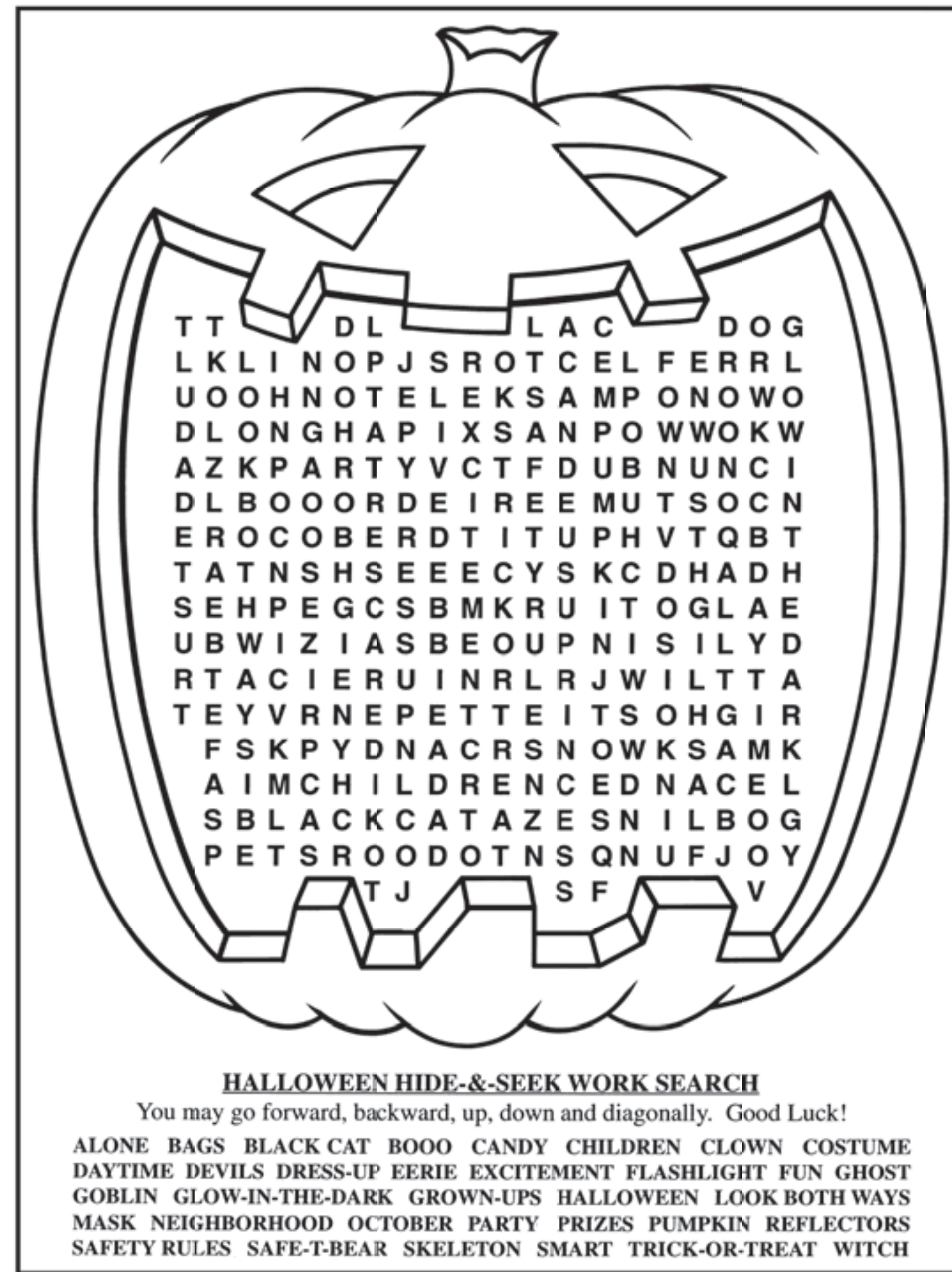


CHECK YOUR TREATS

DON'T TREAT ALL TREATS THE SAME...

Never eat any candy, cakes, cookies or other treats unless your parents or a trusted adult tells you that you can. Sometimes strangers can hand out dangerous treats. It is always safest to throw away unwrapped candy or treats that have a broken wrapper.







TRICK-OR-TREAT TIPS

Always go Trick-or-Treating in a group & with a grown-up! This makes it Fun & Safe!

Trick-or-Treat only at houses that you know are safe and friendly.

Never go into a house or a car unless you & your parents know that person very well.

Ring the bell once, then wait a moment. If an older person lives at the house, please give them an extra minute to get to the door. You'll both be happy!

It gets dark early in October. Make sure you Glow-In-The-Dark in case it turns dark!

Carry a flashlight with you. Even if it isn't dark, you can still make spooky faces !

Wear brightly colored costumes. Better yet, add "Glow-In-The-Dark stickers or reflective stripes to your costume. Nothing is spookier than a driver that can't see you!

Follow the rules of the road. Cross only at corners & crosswalks. Obey traffic signals!

Make sure your costume fits. Be sure that you can see & be seen both day & night!

Never eat any treats until your parents or a trusted adult says it's OK. Sometimes strangers hand out harmful treats. Be sure to brush your teeth after eating your candy!
